



# The Australian Food and Grocery Code of Conduct

PART 3

Conduct GenerallyPaying Suppliers

### APPLICATION OF PART 3 CONDUCT GENERALLY

Part 3 of the legislation does not apply to supplies made by wholesalers to retailers.

This part of the legislation outlines
guidelines for paying suppliers for grocery
products delivered under a supply
agreement.



#### **PAYMENTS TO SUPPLIERS**

- Retailers and wholesalers must pay suppliers for all grocery products delivered in accordance with the supply agreement.
- Payment must be made:
  - Within the time frame set out in the agreement

or

- Within a reasonable time after receiving the supplier's invoice
- Retailers and wholesalers cannot set off any
  amount against a supplier's invoice or remittance
  without written consent from the supplier.



### **SETTING OFF AMOUNTS**

- Retailers and wholesalers cannot require suppliers to consent to a set-off of any amount against their invoice or remittance.
- The prohibition on setting off amounts does not apply if:
  - The grocery supply agreement allows for it; and,
  - The set-off is reasonable in the circumstances
- In any dispute, the onus is on the retailer or wholesaler to establish that the set-off is allowed and reasonable.



#### TIMEFRAME FOR PAYMENT

Payment for grocery products must be made within the time frame set out in the supply agreement.

If the agreement does not specify a time frame, payment must be made within a reasonable time after receiving the supplier's invoice.

The legislation does not provide a specific time frame for payment.



### REMEDIES FOR BREACH OF PAYMENT OBLIGATIONS

If a retailer or wholesaler breaches their payment obligations under a supply agreement, the supplier may seek remedies under the agreement or under the legislation.

Remedies under the legislation include compensation for any loss suffered as a result of the breach.

Retailers and wholesalers may also face penalties under the legislation for breaching payment obligations.



### CONCLUSION

Compliance with the Australian Food and Grocery

Code of Conduct is critical for suppliers and retailers

in the food and grocery industry to ensure fair and

transparent trading relationships.
