FACE TO FACE WITH ... WEST HAM UNITED



MERVYN DAY: At 19 becomes one of Wembley's youngest Cup Final goalkeepers at the end of only his second season. Signed professional from apprentice in March 1973, and manager Ron Greenwood blooded him in September 1973 with the words "This is West Ham's goalkeeper for the next ten years." England Under-23 and Youth International. Born Chelmsford.

JOHN McDOWELL: Powerful-tackling right-back who developed through West Ham's youth side and signed professional in August 1969. League debut October 1970. England Under-23 and Youth International. Born East Ham.

FRANK LAMPARD: Played at Wembley in October 1972 against Yugoslavia—his only full England cap after gaining Youth and Under-23 honours. Signed professional from apprentice in September 1965. Born West Ham.

BILLY BONDS: Respected, batswearing West Ham captain and finished player. Also their penalty-taker. Was a full-back with Charlton Athletic before a £50,000 transfer took him to Upton Park in May 1967. England Under-23 cap. Born Walslow.

TOMMY TAYLOR: Began his career with another East London club, Orient. Was transferred to West Ham for £80,000 in October 1970 and has won England Under-23 honours at centre-half. Born Hornchurch.

KEVIN LOCK: For five years he understood Bobby Moore and now, at 21, he wears the No. 6 shirt that was Moore's for so long at Upton Park. Signed professional from apprentice in December 1971. England Under-23 and Youth Cap. Born Plaistow.

BILLY JENNINGS: From Third Division to First ... from Hackney Marshes football to Wembley is his story book background. At 22, one of the successful new faces at Upton Park—signed for £10,000 in September from Warrford. Where he was last season's top Third Division scorer with 26 goals. Has also led West Ham's goalscorers this season. Born Hackney.

GRAHAM PADDON: Wembley debut appearance against London opponents—he was in the 1973 Norwich League Cup side beaten here by Tottenham Hotspur. Began with Coventry, moved to Norwich for £25,000 in October 1969 and was valued at £170,000 when joining West Ham in an exchange deal for Ted MacDougall in December 1973. Born Manchester.

ALAN TAYLOR: Plays at Wembley less than six months after being in the Fourth Division with Rochdale. Having been signed for £40,000 in November in the first full game for West Ham United scored the two goals that beat Arsenal in Round 6 and repeated the performance in the semi-final replay against Ipswich Town. Age 21. Rejected by Preston North End in his apprentice days. He played for Lancaster and Morecambe before joining Rochdale. Born Lancaster.

TREVOR BROOKING: Supplies West Ham's midfield elegance and comes to Wembley with them in his eighth season of first-team football. Has seven England caps as well as Schoolboy, Youth and Under-23 international honours. Professional since May 1966. Born Barking.

KEITH ROBSON: His Goedicke-type left-wing aggression and goalkeeping ability have been factors in West Ham's top place. He is £45,000 transfer from Newcastle United in September 1971. Injured. His last of both regular matches against Ipswich Town. Born Hetton-le-Hole.

BOBBY GOULD: Powerful, bustling 28-year-old right-winger whose transfers have involved four clubs and totalled £350,000. Began with Coventry City and moved via Arsenal, Wolves, West Bromwich Albion and Bristol City to West Ham in an £80,000 transfer in November 1973. Born Coventry.

Our Visitors  
This afternoon's visitors are our near-neighbours, Charlton Athletic, and we accord them our usual friendly welcome in their first visit to Upton Park this season (we meet later in the Combination Cup).  
Last season found our respective Reserve sides to be very evenly matched. A 4-0 home win followed by the sharing of two goals at The Valley resulted in our edging them out of fifth place in Section B of the Combination on goal average, these being 64-46 and 73-56 respectively. However two 1-0 successes in the Combination Cup gave the Robins the better record overall, and they finished as runners-up in our Group with our second-string one place behind them.  
The visiting side will need little introduction, for their names are all familiar to London fans. There is, of course, a tinge of "brotherly conflict" attached to our meeting, for Benny Fenton (skipper of Charlton) and his brother Ted (manager of the Hammers) always look upon meetings between their respective clubs as a "private duel," although on this occasion it will be a "distant interest" as both will be "on duty" with the first-strings.

In their two matches to date, our visitors have met Plymouth Argyle Reserves (home), winning by 2-1, and have visited Cardiff City Reserves, losing by the same score.
